Actions: What does she do?

<p>What does this show us about him? This shows that he felt defeated and humiliated after the incident occurred and that he was ashamed of his skill and failure.</p>	<p>Physical Appearance/Body Language When he was kicked he just flopped.</p>
<p>Honest: I think this because no matter what he told the truth even after he was caught. An example is when he was asked if he would run, and he replied honestly with, "yes madam."
